Poor-man's bonefish tourney set

The first annual, and possibly ever, Black Hills Flyfishers carp fishing tournament will be held Sunday, Aug. 24, at Angostura Reservoir. Register and wet your line at 9 a.m. Return with your catch at 2 p.m.

The entry fee for the two-person teams is \$20. Other important rules:

- You must use a fly rod.
- You must use a fly.
- You can walk, float, swim, or boat.

Fifty percent of the pot will go to the team with the most carp poundage caught. Thirty percent of the pot goes to the lucky angler who must touch the largest carp. The remaining 20 percent goes to the team with the most fish.

Angling Report

- **Rapid Creek in town:** Use tricos size 20-22s from early morning to 8 a.m.. Switch to caddis evening until dark.
- **Pactola basin:** Small BWOs, Comparaduns, Para duns, or brooksprouts in sizes 20 and 22 are the way to go. Nymph scuds and small midge pupas and wd40s also are working.
- **Deerfield Lake:** Use an intermediate fly line to get down a little bit with olive and black buggers.
- **Upper Castle Creek and lower Castle to Rapid Creek:** It's time to dig out your terrestrials. This is the best time all year for hoppers, foam ants, and foam beetles.
- **Spearfish creek:** Some BWOs and PMDs on top. Down under, use bead head hare's ears, fox squirrel nymphs, and creeping caddis with WD40s. In the ponds in the canyon, (break out the flip focals) small midges like the 22 and 24 brook sprouts are working well.
- **Spring Creek & Boxelder:** Pray for water.
- **Angostura:** Carp are taking white wing flies and hare's ears. There also have been reports of big trout cruising the lake. (Tip: This report is a hint for the Aug. 24 tournament. Take notes.)

Directions: Take highway 79 south to the Angler's Den Bar. Turn right and keep going to the boat landing area. Do not spend the day at the Angler's Den.

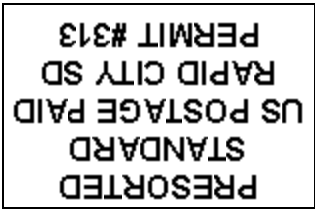
Plan for Sept. meeting
